So who are your neighbours? Where is your neighbourhood?


- The people next door

## • GINGER BREAD PEOPLE

- Make a 'neighbour hood' tree
- Get a grown up to help you with a recipe, utensils and the hot oven. Make as many gingerbread neighbours as you can. Use the templates on page 2 or your own cutters.
- Add eyes, nose, mouth, icing clothes and make a hole to thread through.
- Find some twigs and branches and a large pot, vase or jug. Hang your 'neighbourhood' up to make a tree of friendship.
- Make enough to share with your neighbours as a gift.

## • ZIG ZAG PEOPLE

- Make a chain of your 'neighbourhood' people
- Fold a rectangle of paper concertina-style and draw a person on the top fold so that the hands and feet touch the side folds. Cut around the outline, leaving the hands and feet uncut at the fold to make a chain of zigzag people.



- Give them faces, names and clothes
- Hang them up in your window.
